Thank you for your letter to Tony Blair dated 28 May 1998 about the setting up of an agency for complementary medicine. As this section deals with complementary medicine your letter has been passed to me to reply and I am sorry for the delay in doing so.

You may be interested to know that an independent discussion paper on complementary medicine entitled "Integrated Healthcare - A Way Forward for the Next Five Years?" was published by a charity called the Foundation for Integrated Medicine in October last year. This charity was set up by His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales who has an interest in complementary medicine. This paper makes a number of proposals for the better integration of complementary and conventional forms of medicine. Health Ministers have welcomed this report as a useful contribution to the debate about the role of complementary therapy. The Secretary of State for Health addressed a follow up conference on 28 May 1998 where many of the issues raised in the paper were discussed. I have enclosed a copy of his speech for your information.
